

Ward Councillor

Ward Councillor Ms. E. Swinglehurst reported on the following:-

Report of Cllr. Elissa Swinglehurst November 2015

People often ask me what I do as a ward member; in addition to representing local residents and attending 6 parish councils I am on the Planning Committee, General Overview and Scrutiny and am 'member champion' for social value in procurement and commissioning.

Planning Committee

Things are settling down again after all the excitement of the Core Strategy adoption. Most planning decisions come down to the 'planning balance' between benefit and adverse impact, all other things being equal, but at the least the lack of five year housing supply is no longer part of the argument. The Neighbourhood Development Plans are needed to add the local detail and specific views of local people. I completely support NDPs and take my hat off to those wonderful people who are giving so freely of their time and effort to give their neighbourhood a voice in the planning process. My local NDP has just gone out for consultation (reg.14) – check it out on the Welsh Newton and Llanrothal Website.

Next BIG issue is going to be the Southern Link Road (A49 to A465).

General Overview and Scrutiny

After an excellent debate it was decided, by the Chairman's casting vote, not to recommend sale of the entire small holding estate. The debate highlighted a backlog of maintenance which was estimated at £2.8 million which the Council was not able to fund. When rental income is set against this figure alongside expenditure there is a deficit of 2.63m or £58,000 per tenant. This concentration of public resources is very hard to justify to the general population of the county where libraries, rural transport, and other services are under threat.

Libraries and Museum

Cllr. Emma Holton and I visited the Museum Resource and Learning Centre in Friar Street and were blown away by the quality of the county's heritage collections and inspired by the commitment of the knowledgeable staff. The financial constraints (about which we already know so much) mean that the Museum is likely to lose all the subsidy from the council over the next few years. Cllr. Holton and I are putting together a team of like-minded councillors to do what we can to support the Museum and library services as they transition from subsidy to sustainability.

Watch this space for progress!!

The Annual Harvest.

Most of the maize was taken in before the rains came and I am pleased to report that many farmers were doing what they could to keep the mud off the road – well done to all our farmers who met their responsibility and had road sweepers and bowsers on site. However I would like to repeat the comment I made in a previous report about the danger of using the mobile phone whilst driving – please don't do it (you know who you are) you are endangering yourself and other road users. **Other News Residents say Herefordshire's roads are most improved in the country**

Herefordshire Council has raced ahead of 77 other local authorities to be named as the most improved organisation in the annual National Highway and Transport survey. Balfour Beatty are to be congratulated on the improvements they have brought about, for instance, the cat 2 potholes are now in the 98 percentile for reaction within time limits (up from 30%). The locality working model has proved popular with Parish Councils and residents (we are blessed with the excellent Dave Atkinson looking after Llangarron Ward). This is not to say that we are in a state of perfection but let's just take a moment to appreciate the improvements to date.
