

## Information Sheet for Welsh Newton and Llanrothal Group Parish Council - March 2018

The following information has been emailed to the clerk over the course of the last month. It is for you to be aware of and action as you see fit. ### 1. HEREFORD TRANSPORT PACKAGE (HTP) CONSULTATION

Following the decision made by Herefordshire Council's cabinet on Thursday 18 January to proceed with consultation for the Hereford Transport Package, including the Hereford Bypass, you are invited to a preview event on 5 February for Councillors and parish councils between 12pm and 2pm in the pod next to the Coffee Corner at Old Market, Hereford. There will be staff available to meet you and answer any questions you may have, you will also be able to leave feedback on the bypass should you wish.

Following this, public exhibitions will be held on 6, 7 and 8 February 2018 between 11am and 8pm in the pod. One evening session will be held on Tuesday 13 February from 6pm to 9pm at Whitecross Highschool. If you are unable to attend the preview event please feel free to attend any of these events, staff will be available.

The exhibition will then move to Hereford Library on Friday 19 February where it will remain for the duration of the consultation period, until Tuesday 20 March. The exhibition can be viewed during normal library opening hours and staff will be available to answer questions on Saturday 24 February and Saturday 10 March between 11am and 2pm.

### 2. Herefordshire Council's language service, the Herefordshire Language Network, is offering more training for interpreters in April, and the application process is now open.

On Sunday 22 and Sunday 29 April 2018, a two-day unaccredited "foundation training" course will take place in Hereford city.

The training event is an excellent starting point for anyone who has ever considered trying out interpreting, and could lead to paid work. A very high level of fluency in English and one other language is required. While all languages are welcome, the Network is looking particularly for languages less commonly found in the county, such as Kurdish, Arabic, Filipino, Cantonese, and African and Indian languages. BSL is also welcome. Since 2009, the council has trained over 200 people in interpreting and translation skills, which allows them to work for the Herefordshire Language Network. The Network currently manages around 400 assignments every month for public services and voluntary organisations.
